HONOLULU - The Queen's Health Systems has named both **Sondra Leiggi Brandon** and **Kapunahele J. Montgomery** Vice Presidents of Patient Care.

Sondra Leiggi Brandon has been named VP of Patient Care, Behavioral Health. She will be responsible for developing and implementing business and strategic plans for behavioral health services and programs across the continuum of care.
